Reflection for the Most Holy Body and Blood of Christ Sunday: Year B
The Catholic Christian and the Body of Christ
Rev. Victor Yakubu, Parochial Administrator



I have visited several Catholics in private homes, hospices, and hospitals in need of the anointing of the sick and communion in my priestly practice. In discussing the Catholic faith with them, they always tell me, 'Jesus is important to me.' The sacraments of the anointing of the sick and Holy Communion bring Jesus to those in need of God's presence especially when sick and cannot attend Mass. While anointing brings healing to their souls, the Eucharist strengthens them to bear the pains of suffering.

The desire to receive Holy Communion is a serious one for any Catholic who is unable to attend Mass on Sunday or the weekdays. This is the reason why the Church made a provision for lay Eucharistic ministers. The Eucharistic ministers are a group of lay men and women who do a good job of bringing Holy Communion to the sick and the aged. The Church recognizes their work as extraordinary ministers of the Eucharist and truly counts on their service.

The celebration of the Most Holy Body and Blood of Christ is a reminder to all Catholics of the importance of Holy Communion. What we receive in the Church is the true body and blood of Christ under the species of bread and wine. The words of consecration by the priest change the substances of bread and wine into the Body and Blood of Christ. This process is called 'transubstantiation.'

In the gospel, Jesus broke the bread and gave it to his disciples saying, "Take it, this is my body." He did the same with the cup after blessing it, and said, "This is my blood of the covenant, which will be shed for many." The instruction to the Church is simple, "Do this in memory of me." The Catholic Church, therefore, has taken this mandate very seriously, by celebrating the Eucharist as a memorial of the Lord's Passover.

The Eucharist has brought about the sacred order of the priesthood, in which men are called to the ordained priestly ministry purposely for service in the Church. Every priest brings the memories of the last supper to reality by blessing the congregation with the presence of Jesus. Receiving communion keeps us closer to the source of our Christian joy, Jesus himself. It is important we receive communion at Mass and refresh our spirituality with his presence as we continue the activities of our lives.

Moses encouraged the people of Israel in their journey to the Promised Land with constant reminders of the presence of God. He used blood of goats and rams to seal the covenant between Israel and God. He said to the people, "This is the blood of the covenant that the Lord has made with you in accordance with all these words of his." In this new covenant, Jesus has paid the prize with his own blood through his death on the Cross of Calvary. We no longer need to use the blood of goats and rams to offer sacrifices for cleansing, rather, Jesus has done that for us. The second reading says, Jesus "offered himself unblemished to God" to clean our consciences from dead works so that we serve God, the living God.

I believe that the Eucharist offers us the opportunity to meet Jesus on a personal basis. In the Catholic Church we are privileged to continue with this tradition. It is important we respect this tradition and meditate on the presence of Jesus in our individual lives. When we receive communion, it should spur us to talk to Jesus as our friend who is ready to assist us in our journeys just like Moses did in leading the Chosen People of God. As Catholics who love Jesus, we should make it a point of duty to attend Mass and receive communion.

The Teresa of Avila in her book, Interior Castle, encouraged Christians to develop a relationship with Jesus through 'the interior castles' of their souls. She wrote, "Just as His Majesty has a room of his own in heaven, so he has a special place inside the soul where he alone dwells." For me, the reason why I enjoy visiting the sick and the aged is because I connect these souls to Jesus whom they love. I am only vessel in the hands of God for anointing and administering communion that fills that empty spot. The Catholic Christian is the one who loves Jesus and seeks him as a friend. And what are friends for if they cannot help each other? **Keep praying!**

Important Announcements

[1]. Next Sunday, 6 June is the Feast of the Most Body and Blood of Christ, also known as Corpus Christi. We shall have a procession with the Blessed Sacrament and a Benediction at the end. The procession from 3:00 pm will follow this route: We start from the Church main entrance through the eastside to the courthouse on E. Spring street. Go south on N. 4th street, turn right on Oak Street, and turn right again on N. 3rd street and back to the church for final Benediction. This should take about an hour to accomplish. Please let us turn our en-masse to adore Jesus and show him to the world.

[2]. Fr. Victor Yakubu, the Parochial Administrator, will be on vacation from 20 July until 22 September 2021. The Diocese of Phoenix has approved his vacation extension to enable him to celebrate his Silver Jubilee with his home diocese in Zaria and with classmate, the bishop of Yola. While on vacation, Fr. Raymond Ogboji will supply pastorally for the parish. Fr. Ray, ordained in 2012, is a priest of Zaria studying in Rome. He will arrive Kingman on 28 June and depart on 27 September 2021. Please give him the best support while he is here. Pray for the safe travels of both.

[3]. The weekly adoration suggested by the Bishop Thomas Olmsted in his apostolic exhortation Veneremur Cernui (Down in Adoration Falling, Holy Thursday 2021) will come up soon. Parishioners who have not read the document should please do so. You can download the pdf online via our parish website. The printed/hard copies will be on sale anytime soon from the diocese. As soon as we get them, we shall distribute to our parish community to increase publicity of this exhortation on the Eucharist.

[4]. We encourage parishioners to sign-up for weekly one-hour adoration in the chapel from the website or call Amelia Kent, the Parish Secretary, with your details. Please consider giving time for prayer, meditation, rosary, bible reading, etc. before the Blessed Sacrament in the chapel.

[5]. As announced, we shall continue to keep the side doors to the Church closed every weekend or at any function in the Church. Use the main entrance to access the Church. From the inside, you can always exit the church by the side doors during an emergency.

[6]. Remember our parish picnic on 26 June at Metcalfe Park [Address: 315 W. Beale Street] from 11:00 am to 2:00 pm. Parishioners are welcome to celebrate with others. Also, there will be the burning of our mortgage papers, we do not owe on our church building. Thanks to the parishioners for the support to this project when it started in 2013. We shall be praying for the end of the pandemic and comfort to those who loss loved one. We shall remember our parishioners who died.

[7]. On Sunday 27 June 2021, Fr. Victor Yakubu, our Parochial Administrator is celebrating his Silver Jubilee of Priestly Ordination at the 9:00 am Mass. Please join hands with the Committee headed by David Kent and other leaders to make this a success.

[8]. Every time we are at Mass in the main church, the chapel will be closed from adoration. On Saturday it will close from 3:45 pm until 5:15 pm, and on Sunday from 8:45 am until 12:15 pm. Anyone wishing to engage in adoration should come outside of these timings.

[9]. Anyone wishing to join the Choir please call Amelia Kent to give their name indicating if they would like to sing at the Saturday Mass by 4:00 pm, Sunday 9:00 am mass, or the Spanish mass by 11:00 am. We encourage parishioners to use the hymn books in the pews to make the singing communal and participatory. St. Augustine of Hippo said, "He who sings, pray twice."

**REQUIREMENTS PRIOR TO
THE BAPTISM OF YOUR CHILD**

In order to baptize your child in our parish, the following documents are required before you begin the process.

1. Must be registered parishioner
2. Must have child's birth certificate
3. Godparents must be a practicing Catholic, in good standing. This means they have received Confirmation (certificate is required). If they are married, a copy of their Catholic marriage is required. A letter of good standing and proof of completion of a baptismal preparation is required for both parents and Godparents These forms will be included in packet.

Preparation takes time. Please contact Donna Wicker at (760) 900-2336 to receive all necessary forms and information. I can not set a date for baptism unless all requirements are met.
