

Reflection for The Epiphany of the Lord: Year B The Epiphany of the Lord – January 7, 2024 Fr. Christopher Trummer

Today's feast of the Lord's Epiphany celebrates the Seek fulfillment of God's original purpose for His chosen people. Recall God's initial promise to Abraham: "I will God had said to the prophet Jeremiah, "You will seek me make of you a great nation, and I will bless you and make and find me, when you seek me with all your your name great, so that you will be a blessing. [. . .] in heart" you all the families of the earth shall be blessed" (Gen 12:2 -3). In our first reading from Isaiah, we heard, "Nations opened to you" (Lk 11:9). The Magi seek Christ using shall walk by your light, and kings by your shining reason and faith. They ask, "Where is the newborn king of radiance." The Lord also said through the prophet Isaiah, the Jews? We saw his star at its rising and have come to do "It is too little for you to be my servant, to raise up the tribes of Jacob, and restore the survivors of Israel; I will make you a light to the nations, that my salvation may reach to the ends of the earth" (Isa 49:6). God chose Israel in an exclusive way for the eventual purpose of drawing all Jesus. They had to consult Sacred Scripture in order to find peoples to Himself in an *inclusive* way. Israel was meant to become God's "light to the nations," revealing Him to the world. Despite this lofty vocation, Israel had remained essentially closed off to the world. Now, with the birth of *Find* Jesus Christ and the magi approaching him from the east, it is clear that this original plan of God was finally being "They were overjoyed at seeing the star and on entering the fulfilled.

In modern English, we typically use the word "epiphany' to mean a sudden insight or intuition. It is generally a personal and private phenomenon. But the original meaning of epiphany is the public revelation or manifestation of something. The Epiphany of the Lord is the moment when Christ was revealed to the nations, the Gentiles, who are represented by the magi. Shortly after his birth, the shepherds had come to see him. As Jews, they represented the people of Israel acknowledging their Savior. But now, the magi seek him out and come to worship him. As non-Jewish foreigners, they already foreshadow the Gentiles who will later believe in him and be baptized.

Since most of us are Christians who descend from non-Jewish roots, it's easy for us to take for granted that the Gentiles should be included. However, in our second reading from Ephesians, St. Paul says that the mystery of teachings about Gentiles and his encounters with them, it followed God's will by protecting Jesus from Herod. took special revelation to convince Paul, Peter, and the other disciples that the Gentiles were heirs of God's Every Mass is a Christmas: The incarnate Christ becomes promises.

account of the visit of the magi. We could summarize them as: 1) those who seek God, find Him; 2) those who find people. Him, worship Him; and 3) those who worship Him, share Him.

(Jer 29:13). And Christ said, "Ask, and it will be given to you; seek, and you will find; knock, and it will be him homage." Like the magi who followed the star. we too experience God's handiwork in nature. We can learn about Him indirectly through His creation. But nature is not God. Notice that the star did not lead the magi all the way to him. And of course, it was only by coming into his presence that they could worship him.

house they saw the child with Mary his mother." The magi had assumed that Jesus would be in Jerusalem with the king and other "important" people. Instead, they found him in the lowest place: a manger, a feeding trough for animals.

"They prostrated themselves and did him homage. Then they opened their treasures and offered him gifts of gold, frankincense, and myrrh." Today, all of us have been affected to some degree by consumerism. "What's in it for me? What can I get out of this?" We do have real spiritual needs, but these questions miss the main point. The example of the magi reminds us that the center of worship is sacrifice — in other words, giving and not receiving.

Step Into the Light

How strange it is to think that if not for Herod's directions, the magi would not have known where to find Jesus. They were not Jews, they knew nothing of the old prophecies. It was Herod who convened the scholars. It was Herod who pointed the way — for ulterior motives, certainly, but nonetheless, this is the part he played. It was Herod who made the Epiphany possible.

"Nations shall walk by your light, and kings by your shining radiance," writes the prophet (Isaiah 60:3). A king may keep to the shadows, suspicious of the light — he may foolishly imagine he can snatch it from the sky to keep as his own possession, and, upon finding the light cannot be governed, grow to loathe it, and even seek to extinguish it once and for all.

But all his grand designs will come to nothing because there is no king so powerful that he can see in the dark. And even a man like Herod—a man so jealous that he sought to kill God—cannot prevent the breaking of day.

The Epiphany marks the manifestation of Christ to the Gentiles. It is a celebration of truth reaching places it was not expected to reach, of brightness illuminating corners of the world long ago consigned to shadow. It is a reminder that the battle has already been won, the night is over. All that remains is for us to decide: will we step into the light?

"See, darkness covers the earth, and thick clouds cover the peoples; but upon you the LORD shines, and over you appears his glory."

Why do we do that? Catholic Life Explained

Question:

How are the feasts of the baptism of Jesus and the account of the wedding feast of Cana related to the Epiphany celebration?

Answer:

The Epiphany season focuses on revealing Jesus to the world. Following the Christmas celebration, the liturgical year lays out a series of manifestation points in which Jesus is made publicly known. From its very beginning, the Christian community highlighted three events in the life of Jesus. These are the Epiphany, the Baptism of the Lord and the wedding feast at Cana.

The Epiphany discloses Jesus to the world of the Gentiles, represented by the magi from the East. The accounts of Jesus' baptism reveal his identity and mission, along with exposing him to those to whom he was sent to minister. The miracle of turning water to wine at the wedding feast of Cana, unique to John's Gospel, is the first public sign that Jesus performs, thus manifesting his public identity and his powers.

Today in the Roman Church, these are usually celebrated on three successive Sundays: Epiphany, the Baptism of the Lord which is usually the next Sunday, and the wedding feast of Cana, which is proclaimed on the 2nd Sunday of Ordinary Time in lectionary year C.

These feasts connect around the concept of epiphany, public manifestation of Jesus to the world. They help us get to know more intimately who Jesus is and what he is about. Spend some time delving more deeply into your understanding of who Jesus is. Continue to cultivate these "epiphany" moments in your life.

REQUIREMENTS PRIOR TO THE BAPTISM OF YOUR CHILD

In order to baptize your child in our parish, parent (s) please come to the Parish Office to obtain an outline, describing the necessary requirements — PRIOR to both the parents and godparents being scheduled to att a required pre-baptism class:

Parents


- 1. Must be registered parishioner in our parish
- 2. Parent (s) must be baptized and submit a copy of their Confirmation certificate.
 - 3. If the parents are married, provide a copy of their Catholic marriage
 - 4. Parent(s) must provide a copy of their child's birth certificate.

Godparent (s) At Least One:

- 1. Must be a practicing Catholic, following the teachings of the Catholic faith.
- 2. The godparent must be baptized and submit a copy of their Confirmation (certificate is required).
 - 3. The godparent, if married must provide a copy of their Catholic marriage certificate.

Only after receiving the required documentation, must the parent(s) and godparents (s) have attended the pre-baptism class, can the baptism of your child be scheduled.
