Reflection for Easter Sunday of the Resurrection of the Lord: Year B Easter Sunday of the Resurrection of the Lord – March 31, 2024 Rev. Mark Hellinger

When we read the accounts of the Lord Jesus' appearances in Cor 5:4-5 and Romans 8:18-19, just to name a few). his resurrected Body, we find some curious things. First, people that know him well, those whom he taught and with Now, onto our second point: yes, there is continuity and whom he lived and loved, somehow don't recognize him at discontinuity between the glorified body of the Lord Jesus and first; and second, these people who encounter the Risen Lord Jesus only recognize him at the Lord's initiative.

Let's examine each of these aspects. First, why don't people know who Jesus is? It's true for Mary of Magdala at the tomb. It's true in this Gospel passage from the Evangelist, Saint In this relationship we have and that we try to foster with the Luke. One would assume that Cleopas, a disciple of Jesus, who, along with another disciple on the Road to Emmaus, would have been able to recognize Jesus. Yet somehow he doesn't, and neither does his walking companion. Why?

These encounters of the Risen Lord Jesus, present in his glorified body, with those whom he had at least a passing acquaintance with, if not having been known very well, in his earthly body, fail to have his friends and his disciples recognize him. Therefore, a question for us: what is the nature of the Lord Jesus's risen and glorified Body? Let's examine what we know about this risen and glorified Body of the Lord Jesus Christ from Sacred Scripture and Sacred Tradition, the fonts of Divine Revelation.

To start with, Jesus is not a ghost. He's really there — the same Jesus who walked with them, who taught them, who healed them, who ate with them. Note that one of the things the Lord Jesus seems to want to do all the time in these -resurrection appearances is to eat! Note that in the Gospel of John, chapter 21, the Lord Jesus even says, "Come, have Isn't that true for us, too? Don't we, like the disciples on the breakfast!" Note that the Lord Jesus urges his disciples to road to Emmaus, come to recognize Jesus, he who has called touch him and see that he is real. (Luke 24:37-40). Yet there is also discontinuity. The Lord Jesus can vanish before the eyes of these disciples in today's Gospel (Luke 24:31) and he can walk through walls and locked doors (John good news of the Resurrection? 20:26). The Lord's body is glorified. Saint Thomas Aquinas, the Doctor Communis, tells us in the Summa Theologiae's Yes, this story of the Lord's walk on the road to Emmaus third part, question 54, that Jesus' body is of the same nature, poses some tough theological questions, but even more, offers but of different glory. The Lord's body is still very real, but it us hope! As the Lord's body is risen and glorified, he hopes to is not subject any longer to decay, as it is incorruptible and it share that with us! What should fill our hearts with more is not subject to suffering, as it is impassible.

With that being stated, we know and can state that the Lord's body in his resurrection appearances is a real body, now glorified. There is a real continuity with his earthly body and also a discontinuity, since it is glorified. And the good news is that, if we live our lives in accordance with his teachings,

> his earthly body. His disciples, his apostles, those whom knew him well, at first do not recognize him; they seem to recognize him through faith, and indeed they are called to faith, but, it seems, always at the initiative of the Risen Lord Jesus.

> Lord, it is never us who begin; no, it is always Jesus. Think back to the Magdalene at the tomb on Easter Sunday (John 20). She who is the apostle to the Apostles, a close friend, someone who knew the Lord well, does not at first recognize him. She believes the Risen Lord to be the gardener! And how does she come to know him? The Lord Jesus says her name, "Mary." The Lord Jesus and he alone calls to us and starts the relationship. Like God the Father, when God the Son utters the word, it is created. In this case, the eyes of faith are opened and Mary of Magdala sees him who has been standing right there before her: the Risen Lord Jesus in his glorified

Indeed, it is in the encounter with the Lord Jesus, through his word — and we remember that he is the Word through whom all things were made — and through his actions (for instance, the recounting of the Sacred Scripture related to him and the breaking of the bread with the disciples whom he met on the post road to Emmaus) that the Lord Jesus is made known.

What Would Mary Do?

This Easter morning, I am thinking of Mary Magdalene.

I want to know her state of mind as she approached the tomb in the darkness. Was she afraid? Was she thinking clearly? Was she tired? Had grief and trauma robbed her of her sleep the last two nights? What did she intend to do? Anoint Christ's body, yes — but what else? Kiss his hands, trace the markings where the lash had fallen upon his skin? Say goodbye? Weep? Despair?

What were the words she planned to whisper into the cold, empty darkness that morning, as she wept over God's body?

I don't know anything about her state of mind that Easter morning, except that I know she wanted to be with Christ. Perhaps that was all she knew, too. Perhaps she had no other thought, no other desire, than nearness to him. She didn't need to understand everything, and she didn't expect answers — she didn't dare hope for that.

But everything and everyone had fallen apart around her, and in Jesus' presence she knew her heart would be able to rest.

If you have ever been in the midst of a crisis in your life and found yourself pacing the floors of your house when no one else is awake, muttering the words to a prayer you know by heart, you know what Mary Magdalene felt. In those moments, we do not always feel God's presence. Sometimes, when we look for Him, we only see an empty tomb.

When these dark moments come, I pray you will remember the faithfulness of this great saint. Be like Mary Magdalene. Look for Jesus, always. You may not always find him, but he will always find you.

Why do we do that? Catholic Life Explained

Question:

What is spiritual communion, and do you need to be in a state of grace to receive it?

Answer:

The practice of making a "spiritual communion" dates back several centuries and St. Thomas Aguinas described it as "an ardent desire to receive Jesus in the Holy Sacrament and a loving embrace as though we had already received Him." Traditionally, a prayer of spiritual communion has been used by those who are unable to receive sacramental communion because of health, inability to attend Mass. or who cannot receive communion because of grave sin. This practice has been encouraged by many saints and spiritual writers and most recently Pope Francis encouraged the practice when the realities of the COVID-19 pandemic prevented so many Catholics from taking part in the Mass or receiving sacramental communion.

Although the graces offered in spiritual communion are not the same as those offered in the sacramental communion of the Mass, this practice is still a powerful opportunity to express our desire for union with the Lord and to be united with Christ and the Church, even in an imperfect way.



In order to baptize your child in our parish, parent (s) please come to the Parish Office to obtain an outline, describing the necessary requirements — PRIOR to both the parents and godparents being scheduled to att a required pre-baptism class:

Parents


- 1. Must be registered parishioner in our parish
- 2. Parent (s) must be baptized and submit a copy of their Confirmation certificate.
 - 3. If the parents are married, provide a copy of their Catholic marriage
 - 4. Parent(s) must provide a copy of their child's birth certificate.

Godparent (s) At Least One:

- 1. Must be a practicing Catholic, following the teachings of the Catholic faith.
- 2. The godparent must be baptized and submit a copy of their Confirmation (certificate is required).
 - 3. The godparent, if married must provide a copy of their Catholic marriage certificate.

Only after receiving the required documentation, must the parent(s) and godparents (s) have attended the pre-baptism class, can the baptism of your child be scheduled.



After the formation period, he will discern if he would like to make his promise to become a Missionary Servant of the Word for one year, serving in whatever mission he is sent to here in the United


